EYE CARE: MYOPIA AND CATARACTS

The eyes are considered the 'windows to the soul,' and vision is widely considered our most important and valued sense. But certain eye and vision problems are more common in Chinese. Myopia, or nearsightedness, for example, is so prevalent in the Chinese population that it is almost considered normal. More serious conditions, such as cataracts and certain types of glaucoma, are also common in Asians and can present special challenges to doctors. We will review some of these common conditions and discuss causes and treatments for them, with special attention to the Chinese eye.
