  - Africa




#### General Areas

#### How to select a cruise

- Time and duration for the cruise vacation
  - 3 days to 30+ days
  - Add 1-2 days for international travel
- Budget; air+sea, gratuities, on-board expenses, shore excursions, shopping, etc.
- Itinerary
  - Departing port
  - Climate on the region and route
  - Personal preference; cultural, history, scenery, arts, kids, water sports, physical limitations, etc.

- Popular cruise lines
  - Disney, Royal Caribbean, Holland America, Celebrity, Princess, Norwegian, Costa, MSC, Carnival
- Luxury cruise lines
  - Silversea, Regent Seven Seas, Oceania, Crystal, Cunard, Seabourn, Azamara
- Differences between the two group
  - Price, amenities, on-board activities, guest count, etc.



### Search for the best match

- On-line search;.
  - Cruise.com, Vacations To Go, Cruise Direct, Cruise Critic, Cruise Complete, etc.
  - Input your preference for; time, duration, itinerary, cabin choices, etc.
- What is included in the price package
- Last minute deals
- Beware of scams; deep discounts, cash in front for club membership, free cruise, etc.



### Ready to book

- Choice of cruise ships and sail dates
- Select the cabin
- Select the dinner time; 6:15 pm or 8:30 pm
- Discounts and on-board credits
- Deposit and payment terms
- Invoices and confirmations from the cruise company
- Cancellation policy
- Travel insurance



## Preparations up to Boarding

- Visa requirements for land stays
- Book flights and hotels if necessary
- Complete cruise check-in, get passes/tags, pre-book optional on-shore tours (discount)
- Vaccinations (malaria, tetanus, etc.)
- Check list, important documents & copies, money (cash, credit cards) (waist secure pouch & light backpacks)
- Medicines (duplicate supplies)



### Luggage

- Travel light with layer and quick dry clothes (wash on board)
- Formal attires, dance/gym clothes
- Swimming, snorkel, reading & listening material & equipment
- Water bottles, sun/rain/bug protection (hats, gloves, sunglasses, sun screen; umbrellas, ponchos; bug repellant)
- Canes, good shoes, I-phones, I-pads, cameras, watches, flash lights, whistles



## Things to do before leaving

- Share cruise itinerary and contact information with relatives
- Inform credit card companies of your trip& pay all bills due or soon to be due
- Ask your neighbors to watch over the house (yard sprinkler system) & take mail
- Shut off air conditioning, thermo bottle, computers, lights (keep some exterior ones on with light sensor for shut-off)
- Close & lock all doors and windows



- Playing safe; plan to get on board around 1:00 PM
- Luggage handling
- Buffet lunch is provided on first day
- Get familiar with the surroundings
- Your expenses are handled by your Cruise Card that is also the key for your cabin door.
- Cruise safety; passport, safe, etc.



### On-Board daily activities

- Gym; exercise machines and classes
- Lectures, ship tours
- Games and sports
- Pools and Jacuzzis
- Spa, spa service package
- Shopping, art auctions
- Casino
- Day time and evening time shows



## On-board food and drink

- Restaurants
  - Buffets and regular restaurants
  - Dinner time; 6:15 or 8:30 pm? With friends?
  - Formal dinners
  - Specialty restaurants
- Beverages
  - What is included
  - Drink costs
  - Policy to bring alcoholic beverage on board
  - Buy a beverage package



# On-board phone and internet connections

- Switch off your cell phone's cellular data roaming function
- Internet connections are charged around \$1 per minute. Downloading is very slow!
- Package deals are available
- Tips; get internet connection when you are on port or shore; many local restaurant and coffee shops offer free Wi-Fi for customers.



#### *On-board – other needs*

- Youth and teen programs
- Games; bring your mahjong set
- Laundry services
- Shore excursion booking
- Medical assistance, seasickness, etc.
- Settle the bills, gratuities on last day
- Disembarkation logistics; allowing plenty of time to catch your return flight



#### Optional On-shore Tours

- Book desired ones before boarding for discount
- Consider time constraint when booking
- Port versus tender (more time-consuming)
- To secure better seats: Try to get on bus early (stay close at exit in group waiting area after getting your group tags)
- Have small bills for tips
- Have local currency (get on-board or on-shore)



## Self-negotiated On-shore Tours

- Can get a taxi or van (depending on the group size) at the port and negotiate daily rate & places to visit (language permit)
- Can buy hop-on/hop-off ticket to tour the city
- Must return early to get on board
- Watch out for your own safety
- Can be more economical, more venturous, faster visits
